## North Carolina Fourth of July Festival Announces Parade Grand Marshal

Sunny Point Commander Colonel Heather J. Carlisle to Lead Parade

**SOUTHPORT, N.C.** - The 4<sup>th</sup> of July Festival Committee is pleased to announce this year's parade Grand Marshal will be Colonel Heather J. Carlisle, Commander of the 596<sup>th</sup> Transportation Brigade and Military Ocean Terminal Sunny Point (MOTSU).

"Each year the committee strives to honor those who are or have been in service to our country and this year is no exception," said Karen Sphar, executive vice president for the Southport-Oak Island Chamber of Commerce.
